

Migrant and Refugee Programs.

School-based tutoring support:

Delivered in both Primary and Secondary Schools, our Migrant and Refugee Program aims to support students from Migrant and Refugee backgrounds with tutoring and educational support.

Donut Stress Homework Club:

In partnership with Libraries ACT, our wonderful volunteers are readily available to offer ongoing support for Secondary school-aged students with their homework and assignments. Held every Saturday during term from 1:30PM at Gungahlin Library.





Respite Programs: St Joes 6 – 15. St Nicks Young Carers 9 – 17.

Our respite programs offer opportunities for social inclusion and fun through monthly activities and our school holiday camps. Offered at zero cost to families, our vibrant community of volunteers create a safe-space of belonging through connection and joy. Whether you're introverted, extroverted, creative or active, there is something in our programs for everyone.

Vinnies on Campus:

If you know of or are a secondary school aged student thinking about uni and are passionate about Social Justice issues impacting our community, come join our team of like-minded tertiary-based volunteers who are committed to creating the change that they wish to see in the world. Workshop Updates

Homelessness Workshops

A Home (Years K-2)

Students will learn about what Vinnies does to help people experiencing homelessness and what students can do to help.

Fighting the Cold (Years 3-4)

For this session students will explore Primary and Secondary Homelessness and the challenges of having no shelter.

Breaking the Stigma (Years 5-6)

Students will learn about the three types of homelessness and be challenged to bust myths regarding homelessness.

Social Justice Workshops

Introduction to Vinnies (Years K-2)

Students will learn about how the St Vincent de Paul Society was established and what Vinnies does today.

Social Justice Superheros (Years 3-4)

Students will learn about poverty, our Emergency Assistance service and other services that Vinnies provides.

Challenging Social Injustice (Years 5-6)

Students will explore what Social Justice is and the challenges of poverty.

School Sleepouts

Primary School Sleepout

A Vinnies School Engagement Officer can attend your school sleepout to teach students about homelessness and facilitate some homelessness-based activities.

Secondary School Sleepout

A Vinnies School Engagement Officer can attend your school sleepout to teach students about homelessness and facilitate some homelessness-based activities.

We are also piloting student-led sleepouts with the support of Vinnies staff.

Wellbeing Workshops

The DARE Program (Years 3-6)

Aims to reduce incidences and severity of mental illness through exploring preventative factors such as personal values, character strengths, emotional literacy and healthy relationships; we also encourage help seeking and self-care. Suitable for Years 3-6.

What We Feed Ourselves (Year 9-10)

This program aims to reduce incidences of chronic disease and harm. Suitable for Year 9-10.

Secondary School Conferences 2024

Currently we would like to provide a space for Social Justice Leaders from each school to meet, share what they are doing to help the community and inspire each other; as well as build relationships and further develop their leadership skills.

CEO Sleepout

Our major fundraising event was held last week at the National Museum Australia following months of preparation and brought together the Vinnies team in an immersive experience for participants. Over 100 people slept out at the Museum, along with others in satellite events participating virtually, including our first event on the far south coast in Merimbula which also beat their target.

With a target of \$800,000 for the campaign, on the night the tally was about \$780,000 raised, but by Monday morning an incredible \$823,000 was the total to date. Funds raised will be used to support our frontline homelessness services.

During a cold and wet evening, participants heard some compelling case studies including one involving the Street to Home and Night Patrol successfully assisting a companion into her own flat after many years of trauma and sleeping rough, whilst the St. Nick's young carers program was also showcased. Participants also had the opportunity to meet a range of our programs and services on arrival to gain a deeper understanding of the impact of our work and the Museum proved to be an ideal venue for the experience. These insights enable those who take part, of which about half were doing it for the first time, to understand better the complexity of our work, the challenges we face serving our companions and how the funds raised are put to good use helping those in need.
