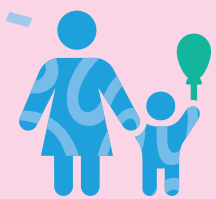

**Struggling Queensland families like Sarah's\* had a festive season filled with extra love and extra joy, thanks to your wonderful kindness.**

We wrote to you about Sarah last year, sharing how a car accident that left her husband with a brain injury meant they were experiencing poverty and were at risk of homelessness.

You opened your hearts, showing overwhelming generosity, donating so families like Sarah's could receive emergency food vouchers and hampers – putting a meal on the table and joy in their hearts at Christmas.

Your kindness also meant other Queenslanders could stay in their homes at a time of year when home means so much, receiving financial assistance with essentials like medical expenses, running the family car, and paying bills, so they could afford their rent.

Many families are now also receiving ongoing support, so poverty and homelessness will not become their new normal.

Sarah spoke to us recently. She had great news.

Her family had recently moved into a 4-bedroom, 2-bathroom home near the children's school.



Your kindness helped them once again, helping pay for the removal truck and some extra furniture they needed to make their new house a home.

**Sarah told us how much your kindness means to families like hers.**

**“When people care enough about another human, they’re doing it for people they don’t know. But they can be assured that the kids’ faces light up on Christmas. It’s true, genuine help. That’s really what it’s about.”**

# Families like Chloe's need your help

**Chloe's family was doing well until one day, things took a rapid turn for the worse.**

Her husband fell ill and could not work. The home they had been renting was put up for sale, so they had to move out. And with the housing crisis pushing prices up, they could not find anywhere affordable to live.

**They suddenly found themselves homeless.**

After couch surfing with friends, Chloe reached out to Vinnies QLD and was able to secure crisis accommodation for her and her family in a hotel, but their homelessness journey was far from over.

**"We were all three of us sharing the one bedroom, bathroom, lounge room. We had no yard and we had our small dog, too. We were lucky the hotel allowed us to have the dog,"** - Chloe

The family still needed a permanent home.

The cost-of-living crisis and the chronic shortage of affordable housing is pushing families like Chloe's into homelessness all over Queensland.
