Meet Corpus Christi College

Corpus Christi College takes immense pride in its ongoing partnership with Vinnies. Students engage with Vinnies throughout the year through service learning, donation drives, and awareness-building initiatives.

Year 10 students recently visited Vinnies services during their student retreat 'Answering the Call.' Students visited community organisations, gained insights into their activities, and spent a day volunteering. At the Vinnies depot in Canning Vale, they sorted donations and assembled hygiene packs for people at risk of or experiencing homelessness. Reflecting on the experience, one student shared, 'Vinnies was very good, I had with the people I had. The little tour at the beginning was very fun because you got to learn more about what they do and how they help people...'

Term Two saw the start of collecting donations for the Vinnies Winter Appeal. Students contributed warm clothing, blankets, canned food, and hygiene materials. They also look forward to their annual Winter Sleepout, which provides firsthand insight into homelessness by spending a night "sleeping rough" while supporting a great cause. It's an opportunity for students and staff to understand the challenges faced by those experiencing homelessness. The event focuses on fostering empathy and awareness among participants, emphasizing the importance of compassion and social responsibility.

The ongoing collaboration between Corpus Christi College and Vinnies nurtures socially responsible and empathetic individuals. Through service work, donations, and immersive experiences like the sleepout, the College reinforces the values of compassion, courage, and commitment throughout the community.
