Do you remember reading about sisters Abigail and Isabella? During winter, their story inspired generous people like you to dig deep and support vulnerable Queenslanders in need. Thank you to everyone who donated!

The sisters grew up around violence, instability, and neglect. As a result, they struggled with school and spent large parts of their childhoods homeless.

As soon as they were old enough, they applied for their own housing and created a safe, loving home together. But the sisters had no furniture, or household items.

That is when the kindness of people like you came into their lives.

Your support meant hardworking Vinnies QLD volunteer members Christine and David could help provide the sisters with a fridge, washing machine, lounge, and everything they needed to set up their home.



Soon after Levi's mum died, his life began to unravel. Without a family home to stay in, he spent 18 months sleeping on the street – with just a thin layer of cardboard between him and the hard concrete.

"My health was going down the drain and it was taking its toll on me mentally." – Levi.

Homelessness was isolating and lonely too. Levi quickly learned the best way to stay safe was to sleep in carparks alone each night – and not trust anyone.

Levi's story is all too common. On any given night, over 22,000² Queenslanders like him will experience homelessness. Many will spend tonight sleeping on a sheet of carboard.
